- reduce the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our business and supply chains;
- provide adequate protection for whistleblowers.

Risk and compliance

Generis Corporate Finance LLP regularly evaluates the nature and extent of its exposure to the risk of modern slavery occurring in its supply chain by regularly reviewing our suppliers and supporters to ensure their aims are aligned with ours.

We do not consider that we operate in high risk sectors or locations.

We enforce a strict code of compliance and do not tolerate slavery and human trafficking within our supply chains.

Training

We invest in educating our staff to recognise the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and supply chains. Through our training programmes, employees are encouraged to identify and report breaches of our anti-slavery and human trafficking policy. Employees are taught the benefits of stringent measures to tackle slavery and human trafficking, as well as the consequences of failing to eradicate slavery and human trafficking from our business and supply chains.
